SUMMARY OF LAST EVENT:

'Autonomous Driving – The State of Standards, US Regulations, Legislation, and Policy'

PRESENTED BY: Barbara Wendling, Safety, Fuels, and Regulatory Affairs, Mercedes-Benz Research and Development, North America

On September 25, 2017, roughly 45 SAE BC members, student members, and industry members gathered at BCIT's Burnaby campus to attend a talk on autonomous driving regulation by Barbara Wendling of Mercedes-Benz, North America who chairs the SAE J3016 Task Force: Taxonomy and Definitions for Terms Related to Driving Automation Systems for On-Road Motor Vehicles.





The event started out with sandwiches and other refreshments followed by networking time with the other attendees. Barbara started her talk with an introduction of herself followed by an overview of her work at Mercedes before delving into more detail of her work with SAE and the standards she is currently developing. She graciously answered numerous questions throughout the presentation and afterwards before having to conclude due to time. Clearly there is a huge interest in this upcoming technology.
